1. District in General

1.1. Geographic position (with map):

Baksa district is located in the north-western part of Assam with the district headquarter at Mushalpur, which is 105 Km away from state capital Dispur, Guwahati and 20 Km away from National Highway no.31 towards north. The main mode of connectivity with the district is by Road. The geographical position of the district is $-26^{\circ}37''N - 26^{\circ}83''N$, $90^{\circ}80''E - 91^{\circ}85''E$. The altitude of the district is 48.15 Mts. above mean sea level. The total Geographical area of the district is 1852.16 sq Km.




Fig1: Baksa District Map

1.2. History:

Baksa district falls under Kamrup Duars which includes the region between the Manas river and the Barnadi river. The two Duars under Baksa district are Chapakhamar and Gurkola. From the early 17th-century to mid 19th century Baksa district was under the control of Kingdom of Bhutan and under the jurisdiction of Tongso Penlop, below the Tongso Penlop were Subah who in turn appointed Mondal, Laskar or Uzir to look after the Duars. In 1841, the British East company removed the

Bhutanese influence and later the area was merged to undivided Kamrup district of the Indian Union in 1949. Baksa was notified as one of the districts of Bodoland Territorial Council in October 2003 while it started functioning from 1 June 2004. This District falls under the Bodoland Territorial Council (BTC) which is a territorial privilege established according to the Memorandum of Settlement of February 10, 2003. BTC came into existence immediately after surrender of BLTF cadres. The BTC has 12 electorate members each looking after a specific area of control called somosthi. The area under the BTC jurisdiction is called the Bodoland Territorial Area District (BTAD). The BTAD is to consist of four contiguous districts — Kokrajhar, Baksa, Udalguri and Chirang — carved out of seven existing districts — Kokrajhar, Bongaigaon, Barpeta, Nalbari, Kamrup, Darrang and Sonitpur .The BTAD is created under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution of India. Baksa district was created from parts of Barpeta, Nalbari, and Kamrup districts. A very small part of Darrang District also falls within the District. In order to get a clear picture of the history of Baksa the history of erstwhile undivided Kamrup district can be traced back from which the districts of Barpeta, Nalbari and the present Baksa were curved out.

1.3. Topography:

Baksa district shares the privilege of being the International Boundary with Bhutan in the North with a mixed topography of plains and foot hills. The gentle and gradual slopes can be seen stretching from the foot hill of Bhutan and reaching out to the southern tips of Barpeta, Nalbari and Kamrup district.

1.4. Natural Resources:(Rivers, water bodies, forests, land use, land use pattern, land capability classification, soil type and expanse)

Rivers, water bodies: The district contains a network of three major rivers namely Beki, Pagladia and Barnadi and around ten small rivers (Puthimari, Baralia, Mara Pagladia, Kaldia, Manas, Pahumara, Balti, Suklai, Tihu and Nona) which are very active during summer season. The Dong water system is a lifeline for 100 of villages along the Indo-Bhutan Boarder in Baksa district of Assam. Due to lack of national

water bodies and inaccessibility of ground water, villagers depend on this century old traditional system of water management.

Soil type and expanse: The overall soil of the district has been classified into two orders namely- i) Entisols (new alluvium) and ii) inceptisols (old alluvium). 


Fig.1 Monthly mean maximum Temperature




Fig.2 Monthly mean minimum Temperature




Fig.3 Monthly Relative Humidity




Fig.6 Post-Monsoon season Rainfall pattern




Fig.8 Month-wise Rainfall Pattern

1.7. Culture and education

The district is predominantly inhabited by the Bodo people hence the influence of Bodo art and culture is seen much in the district. Along with it, the culture of other caste and tribes can also be seen in the district.

Generally, two cultural trends can be seen in Baksa district. One is general and other is that of tribal people. While the General women wear Mekhela Sador and Saris, the tribal people especially Bodo women wear Dokhona. All the male people irrespective of caste and creed wear trouser while at outdoors and Gamocha when in home.

Different kinds of dances are prevalent in Baksa district. While Assamese speaking people's favourite dance is Bihu, Bodos and other tribes have divergent types of dances. Varied Bodo dances are- Bagurumba, Kherai, Mwchaglangnai, Daosa-Thwi- Lwngnai, Rwnswndri etc. Adivasi dances are- Jhumoor dance, Karam dance, Domkaich dance etc.. Nepali dances are- Sangini dance, Loknritya, Khukri dance etc.

Almost all kinds of festivals are celebrated in the district. International, National and Local- every festival is celebrated with plumb and gaiety. International festivals like Christmas, 31st Dec Night and New Years day is very popular with Christian masses in particular and non-Christian in general. National festivals like Durga Puja, Kali Puja, Diwali, Ganesh Puja, Rash Yatra, Saraswati Puja etc. are also celebrated with equal spirit and fervour. Local festivals like- Bihu, Bwisagu, Magh Bihu, Magw, Bathou Puja etc. are also observed with plumb and gaiety.



3. Constraint and prospect of development of Agricultural sector in the district Prospects

Domestic and International trade: The district of Baksa which falls under the lower Brahmaputra valley zone also shares an international border with Bhutan. The district, dominated mainly by tribal population has an agro based economy with a cultivable area of around 51% of total geographical area. The connectivity of the district is also an advantageous factor which is just around 100 kms from the state capital. Moreover, the historical trade connectivity with Bhutan is an another favourable element in agricultural trade. The inter state boundary between Assam and West Bengal is around 160 km which is a gateway to the mainland India can facilitate the national domestic trade of agricultural produce. This transit facility also can be helpful in outsourcing crops and machineries from mainland India which can boost the production in the district.

Crop diversification: With a cropping intensity of more than 165%, the district prospers in the agriculture sector due to favourable land types and diversified climatic and geographical conditions. The wide range of geographical conditions with variations in altitude increases the diversity of agriculture crops. The northern part of the district with high altitude along the Bhutan foothills produces some best quality arecanut. The southern part of the district which is relatively plain and abundant in upland area excels in cereal and oilseed production. The western part of the district under the Salbari sub-division is the popular zone for Assam lemon cultivation which had catered different domestic as well as international markets. The district also boasts for its abundance in medicinal crops. The traditional cuisines of the Bodo community is dominated by different lesser known plants which are said to have

important medicinal properties. During recent years, the district witnessed the introduction of many new crops and ventures like Dragon fruit, strawberry, millet, mushroom which had added to its diversity. The successful introductions was possible only due the positive attitude of the farmers towards new technologies. Animal husbandry is also a potential sector in the district which has been assimilated with the cropping system creating a sustainable farming system. These diversities can be utilised to target quality production through identification of more specified areas with crop specific and site specific scientific intervention.

Quality produce: There are some pockets in the district specially in the northern part which has not been touched by modern agricultural technologies and where the traditional system still prevails. There is a great scope for formalising these traditional systems into certified organic productions. Moreover, the rate of chemical application in the district is quite low which can be further streamlined to Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) through proper interventions.

Agro based industry through value addition: Value addition is not a novel feature among the inhabitants of the district. From preparation of turmeric powder and mustard oil to supari preparation and dried vegetables, the value addition is a household practice. So, there is a great scope for converting or improving these home consumed produces to market driven products through skill training and converting these individual units into a agro-based industry through aggregation.

Constraints:

Bio hazard: One of the serious bio hazard in the district is the elephant conflict. It has hampered and restricted agricultural production in many areas of the district.

Irrigation: The part of the district near the Bhutan foothills becomes dry during the Rabi period which requires heavy irrigation. Although the traditional 'dong' system of irrigation relieves the agriculturists to certain extent, this facility is not available uniformly and moreover, it is completely nature dependent.

Availability: Apart from quality planting material, the availability of the modern tools for agriculture, chemicals is also a big barrier in scientific crop production. For

example, foot sprayer is an important tool in arecanut plantations for application of chemicals. However, it is not readily available in the local market.




Fig: Road and Railway connectivity of Baksa district
